



IAMHP and member Health Plans are committed to ensuring Medicaid Members continue to receive high quality care. As a result, IAMHP, Managed Care Organizations (MCOs), and the Department of Healthcare and Family Services are working to ease the burden for Medicaid Providers by turning off Ordering, Referring and Prescribing edits during the public health crisis.

Health Plans	ORP Edit Turned Off	Reprocessing
Aetna	Turned off ORP edits on 4/3/2020	If reprocessing is necessary, Aetna will reprocess the claims. Reprocessing of claims will be completed by 5/1/ 2020.
Blue Cross Blue Shield	Turned off ORP edits on 3/27/2020	Providers who wish to resubmit may do so within timely filing guidelines. BCBS will not reprocess claims with dates of service prior to 3/9/2020.
CountyCare	Turned off ORP edits on 3/27/2020	If reprocessing was necessary, CountyCare reprocessed the claims. Providers may file a dispute if they believe a claim was not reprocessed.
Humana	Turned off ORP edits	If reprocessing is necessary, Humana will run weekly reports and reprocess as needed.
IlliniCare	Will be turning of ORP edits. Date has not been determined yet.	Providers who received rejected claims, will need to rebill any rejected claims. IlliniCare's ORP logic does not allow ingestion of claims.
Meridian	Turned off ORP edits on 3/27/2020	Providers must resubmit claims rejected due to ORP.
YouthCare	Edit will be turned off on 4/23	Providers must resubmit claims rejected due to ORP after 4/23.
Molina	Turned off ORP edits on 4/7/2020	If reprocessing is necessary, Molina will reprocess the claims. Reprocessing of claims will take 4-6 week.
NextLevel	For institutional services: Will turn off edits by 4/23/2020 For professional services: Manual interventions ceased on 4/6/2020 For pharmacies: turned off ORP edit on 4/8/2	If reprocessing is necessary, NextLevel will reprocess the claims.
